Treasures of the Sanctuary—Lesson 15—"The Heavenly Day of Atonement"

OPENING DISCUSSION QUESTIONS/TALK:

- 1. Why do you think most people around the world will agree that stealing, killing, cheating on your marriage partner, and lying are all evil or disgraceful things?
- 2. Why do so many people feel guilty about doing these *bad* things? How can they receive peace and be free of their guilt?

READING AND STUDY QUESTIONS:

- 1. Were people forgiven for their sin at the Altar when the blood of the Lamb was poured out for them? (Leviticus 4:29-31) (in the same way, we are forgiven for our sins when we receive Jesus Christ's forgiveness)
 - a. They were indeed saved by the blood. This blood was then **taken into the Sanctuary.** So, there was still a **record of their sin** in the Sanctuary.
 - b. If someone chose to abandon the atonement for a reckless life of sin, would their sins then stand against them? (Ezekiel 18:24)
- 2. On the Day of Atonement the final cleansing was made. This is when **the high priest would come "near before the Lord."** (See Leviticus 16:1,2)
 - a. This was a day of "cleansing the Sanctuary" (See Leviticus 16:16,18,19,29,30). It was a very special and solemn time. People were searching their hearts. They had been forgiven and now at this time, even the record of all their sins was being **cleansed away**!
