3.	Priests were expected to cleanse themselves of sin. They were to have a pure and holy life! What does the Apostle John say about the purifying of Christ's people? (1 John 3:2,3)	
4.	How is God calling us to separate ourselves from the world today? (2 Corinthians 6:16-18) "touch nothing." " out fromthem" Does this mean that our lifestyles will have to be very different than those of the world?	
5.	What should be cleansed from our lives?(2 Corinthians 7:1) (Sinful thoughts and actions should be cleansed out of our lives through Jesus Christ's power and grace—flesh and the Spirit)

5:16-25) All the evil works that we see in the world today are the product of the sinful human

10.	What other practical instruction should Christians follow in representing Jesus to the world?
	(1 Timothy 2:9, 10) We should not be trying to "deck out" ourselves with all the outer display of the world. Christians are not to be keeping up with all the "fashions" and adornment of the world. We should instead be striving display Christ's humble character to the world. We should be attracting souls to Jesus, not attracting souls to ourselves through the love of display. The "braided or broidered hair" mentioned in this passage refers to "thin plates of gold" that "were often mixed with the hair, to make it appear more ornamental by the reflection of light and of the solar rays. Small golden buckles were also used in different parts; and among the Roman ladies, pearls and precious stones of different colors." (Adam Clarke's Commentary on the Bible). So, this verse is not saying that we shouldn't fix our hair to look neat; instead, it's saying that we shouldn't be making an ornamental display of ourselves throughout our daily life. Does God call His men and women to be modest in their dress? (this is an entirely different trend from the world).
